

## **Holy Cross High School President Margaret Leger to Retire After 38 Years of Service**

The Brothers of Holy Cross and the Holy Cross High School Board of Directors announce that Holy Cross High School President Margaret Leger will retire at the end of the school year.

Prior to being named the school's President in 2017, Mrs. Leger filled a number of roles at Holy Cross since her arrival 38 years ago. In the fall of 1980, she was hired to teach physical education and to coach cross country and track. In addition to her teaching obligations, she became the Assistant to the Director of Students in 1982. She spent 22 years as the Assistant Principal/Director of Students before assuming the role of Assistant Principal for Academic Life. In 2009, she became the Principal of Holy Cross.

"It has been my honor to be a part of the Holy Cross family," said Mrs. Leger. "I have made lifelong friendships with colleagues and teachers and established wonderful connections with many alumni. I'm also pleased that my three children are proud Crusaders. My admiration and commitment to the school will endure. Being a part of this school's history is a true blessing."

Since Mrs. Leger's appointment as President, the school's Board members, administrators, program directors and faculty have maintained the standards of excellence that were established almost fifty years ago when the school opened. "Peg's history with this school is long and rich," said Jeffrey Fryer '87, Chairman of the Board of Directors. "Under her leadership and care, Holy Cross High School realized many successes. Her legacy will be felt for many years to come."

The Board of Directors will embark on a national search for Holy Cross High School's next President. They will work with an outside firm to find candidates. Holy Cross anticipates that a new President will be selected by July 2018.
