## **National Hispanic Heritage Month (September 15 to October 15) celebrates the histories, cultures and contributions of Americans of Hispanic/ Latino descent.**

The observation, which begins on Sept. 15 to commemorate the anniversary of independence for Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua, started as Hispanic Heritage Week in 1968. In 1988, the observation was expanded to 30 days. The term Hispanic or Latino, refers to Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin regardless of race.
